1) ROLL CALL

D. McNally called the Advisory Board Meeting to order at 9:00 AM stating this meeting will be recorded for the purposes of the notes of the Board Minutes.

2) Submit Grant Application- year round, system wide, fare free- VOTE

R. Malnati explained the reason for the Emergency Advisory Board Meeting to vote whether or not BRTA is included in a grant application to MassDOT for RTAs to implement year-round fare free service. There is \$30M in the State budget, specific to this application and is due September 20, 2024. This is either an in or and out situation that is the result of the past pilot fare free events. BRTA's Approved Budget Income line item for fares is \$763,107, which includes both the projected fares for the new commuter service and the fare free events in July 2024 and Holiday 2024. Backing both values out, the projected fare revenue for FY 25 is \$629K. There will be one grant application for the RTAs, using the FY23 NTD certified information. BRTA's share of the \$30M would be \$700K. As the application is due towards the end of September and may not be awarded until October or November, BRTA would like to apply for up to 9 months of fare free funding (Jan-Sept. 2025). BRTA has already been awarded grant funding for fare free during the Holiday season (part Nov-Dec. 2024). If this is offered again in FY 26, BRTA will have already started this process for the first quarter of FY26.

J. Minacci made a motion to apply for this funding and B. O'Grady seconded the motion. Discussion:

A concern was raised of increased ridership could increase undesired activities on the bus and riders taking the ride, instead of a short walk. The idea of a ½ fare initiative rather than full fare, with seniors even more reduced. This way "there is skin in the game" to encourage ridership rather than a free ride. There wasn't a lot of time to research all of the transit authorities to find out the progress. Berkshire Regional Planning Commission has recommended applying for this grant as this will benefit many people in Berkshire County, as both MassDOT and the State have researched fare free. There was great sentiment in the group that fare free would be very beneficial to the residents of Berkshire County. Another concern was voiced that BRTA's fleet lacked enough larger vehicles to handle the increased capacity. Many of the Board agreed that the grant funding description was specific to fare free and BRTA is either in or out. The public perception if other RTAs in the state are free but BRTA is not, may be an issue. There is a little administrative cost savings with fare free and the previous fare free events have provided double digit increases.

- J. Boyle said, "call the question". Votes were 11 ayes and 1 nay.
- R. Malnati will apply for grant funding for 9 months of fare free service for fixed route and Complementary ADA services beginning January 1, 2025 through September 30, 2025.
